



## Students Expectations & Clinics Requirements

**Students must attend the orientation session, all seminars, rostered clinic days or clinic sessions.**

1. Please note that all students are required to attend an orientation session to ensure appropriate onboarding prior to participation in the Clinic. The orientation session will be scheduled in Week One and in-person attendance is mandatory. Failure to attend will result in loss of placement.

2. Failure to have 100% attendance for all seminars, rostered clinic days or clinic sessions will result in a NCN (fail) mark for the course.

- 2.1 Only exceptional circumstances beyond a student's control can warrant an exception to rule 2
- 2.2 An application to justify less than 100% attendance must be made in writing directly to the convener, prior to the relevant seminar/clinic day or session. Students must supply appropriate supporting documentation with their application.
- 2.3 Exceptional circumstances that warrant approval to be absent include, but are not limited to:
  - a) Medical reasons (student injury, illness or medical condition) of such significance that presence in the seminar/clinic is not possible; or have an existing EAP in place.
  - b) Family/personal reasons (family injury or illness, bereavement) of such significance that presence in the seminar/clinic is not possible.

*Please note that work commitments, being overseas/interstate or having clashing commitments will not be considered an appropriate circumstance to warrant an absence.*

3. Students who accept their offer into a clinical course must remain enrolled and complete all assessments. Students who no longer wish to undertake a clinical course must contact [enquiries.law@anu.edu.au](mailto:enquiries.law@anu.edu.au) at least two weeks before the start of the clinic.

4. Students must adhere to the [ANU Student Code of Conduct](#) when undertaking the clinical course. All communication must be respectful and constructive, free from discrimination or harassment.

5. ANU will not accept any liability for failure of a student to comply with the student's expectations and clinical course requirements, or failure of the student to comply with all laws, health protocols or directions from government Authorities.

6. Please note that students can only undertake one clinical placement offered by the ANU College of Law.
